



Help NBC Shine Online!

Have you ever checked the reviews of a restaurant or hotel before visiting? How about prior to purchasing something on Amazon? Now, more than ever, people are relying on Google reviews to help make decisions about almost anything. Google reviews are one of the most powerful ways for new families and community members to find us. When people search for a local church, strong positive reviews help our ministry stand out and reassure them that this is a welcoming place to belong.

Think about your review as a personal testimony about Northside Baptist. In your review, you can include things like: what you love about NBC; how NBC has supported you, your family, or your community; what you enjoy about the worship, programs, or outreach, or why you think others may want to visit.

Writing a review is easy. Open Google and search for Northside Baptist Church. When you see our church listed, click on the link or the stars to open up a side panel. Click reviews and then select the number of stars and type your review. Don't forget to click post when you're done. Scan the QR code for a short tutorial.
